

Yehudi vs. Mitzri Makkos Game

Grade Level: Early Childhood-Lower Elementary (1-3)

Description:

Make the makkos real with the vivid illustrations of this exciting matching game. Students can match up to three combinations: what happened to the Mitzri - what happened to the Jew - the name of the makkah. Add and remove pieces to the guide board to vary the level.

Goals/Objectives:

Students will match the correct pictures and names to the words to gain an understanding of how the Makkos affected the Mitzrim in contrast to the Jews. Students will recognize and/or practice reading the written names of the makkos.

Materials Needed:

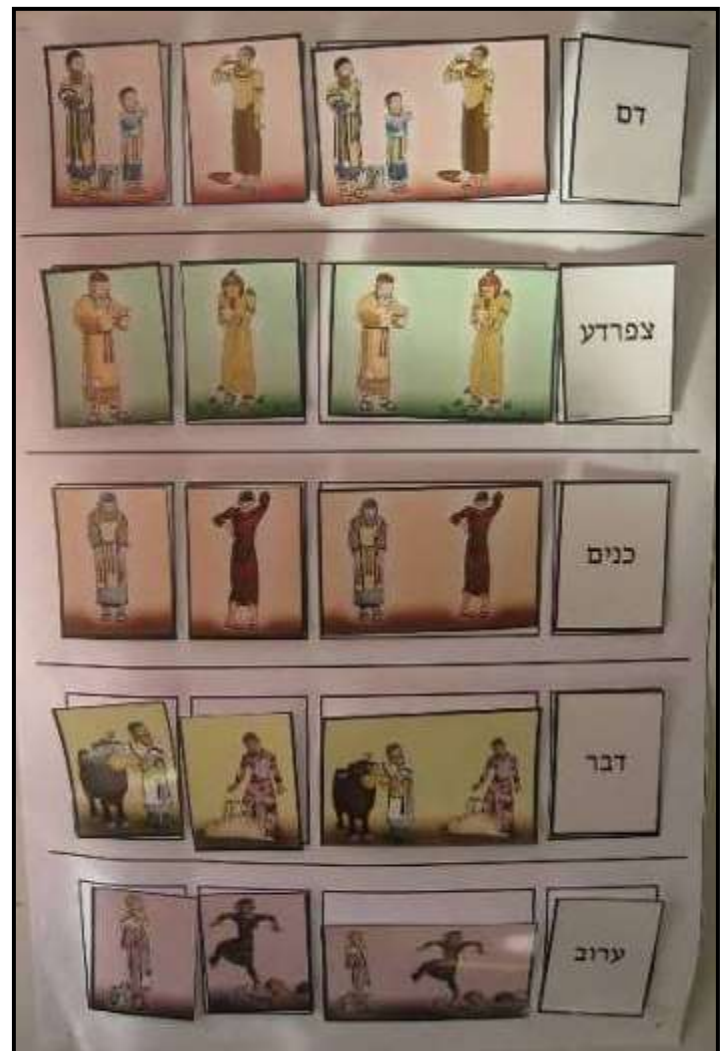
- Background poster
- Makkos cards: name cards, miztri cards, and yehudi cards

Material Preparation:

1. Print, laminate and cut the cards.

Detailed Instructions – Classroom Use:

1. Place the background poster on the floor.
2. According to the students' ability, choose which cards should be on the poster as guides and which cards should be interactive.
3. Students match the cards to the board (five at a time). The makkos should be placed in the correct order that they happened.
4. The makkos name cards can also be numbered on the back so students can match the number to the makkah.



Variation(s):

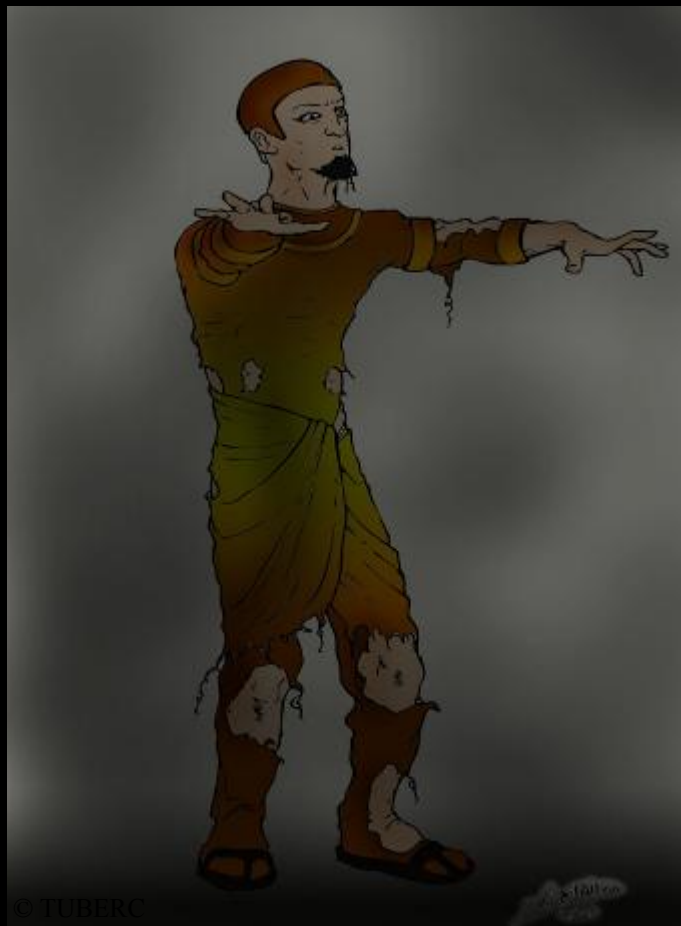
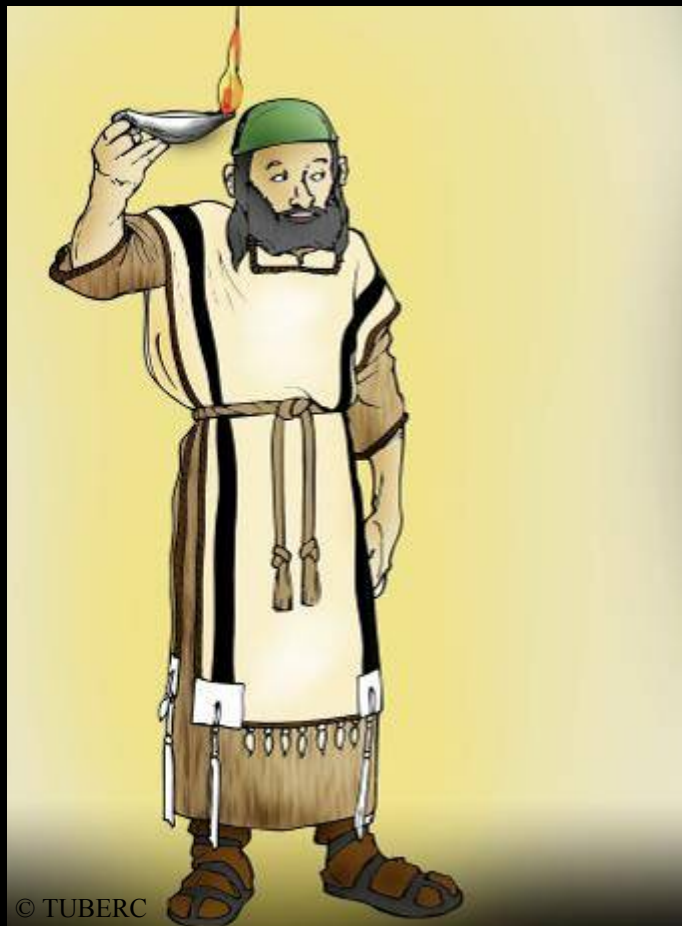
- Use the cards to play a memory game. Place name cards and Mitzri cards face down. Students flip cards to find the match.

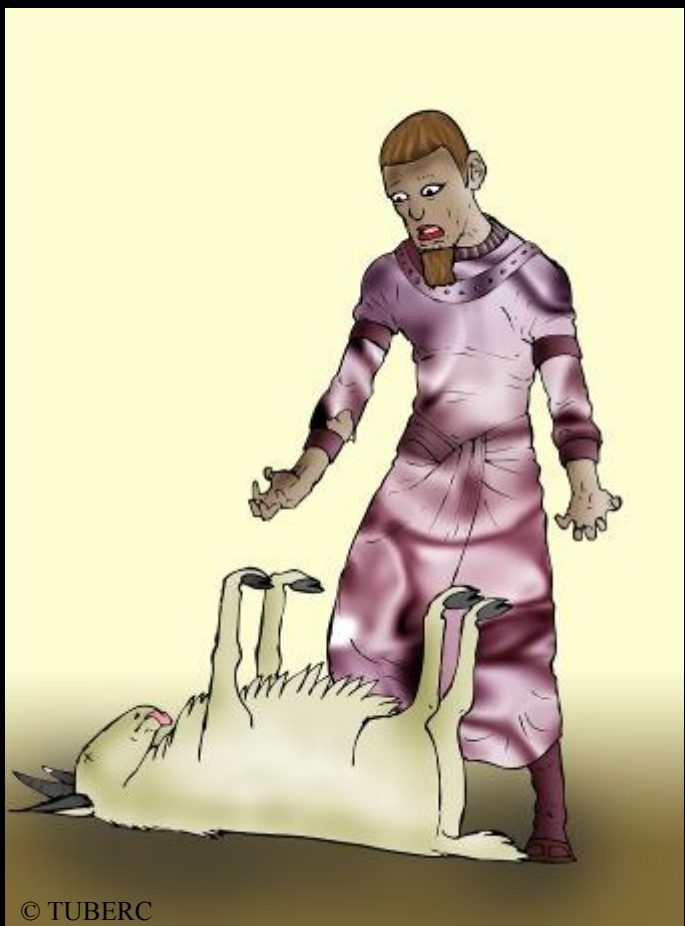

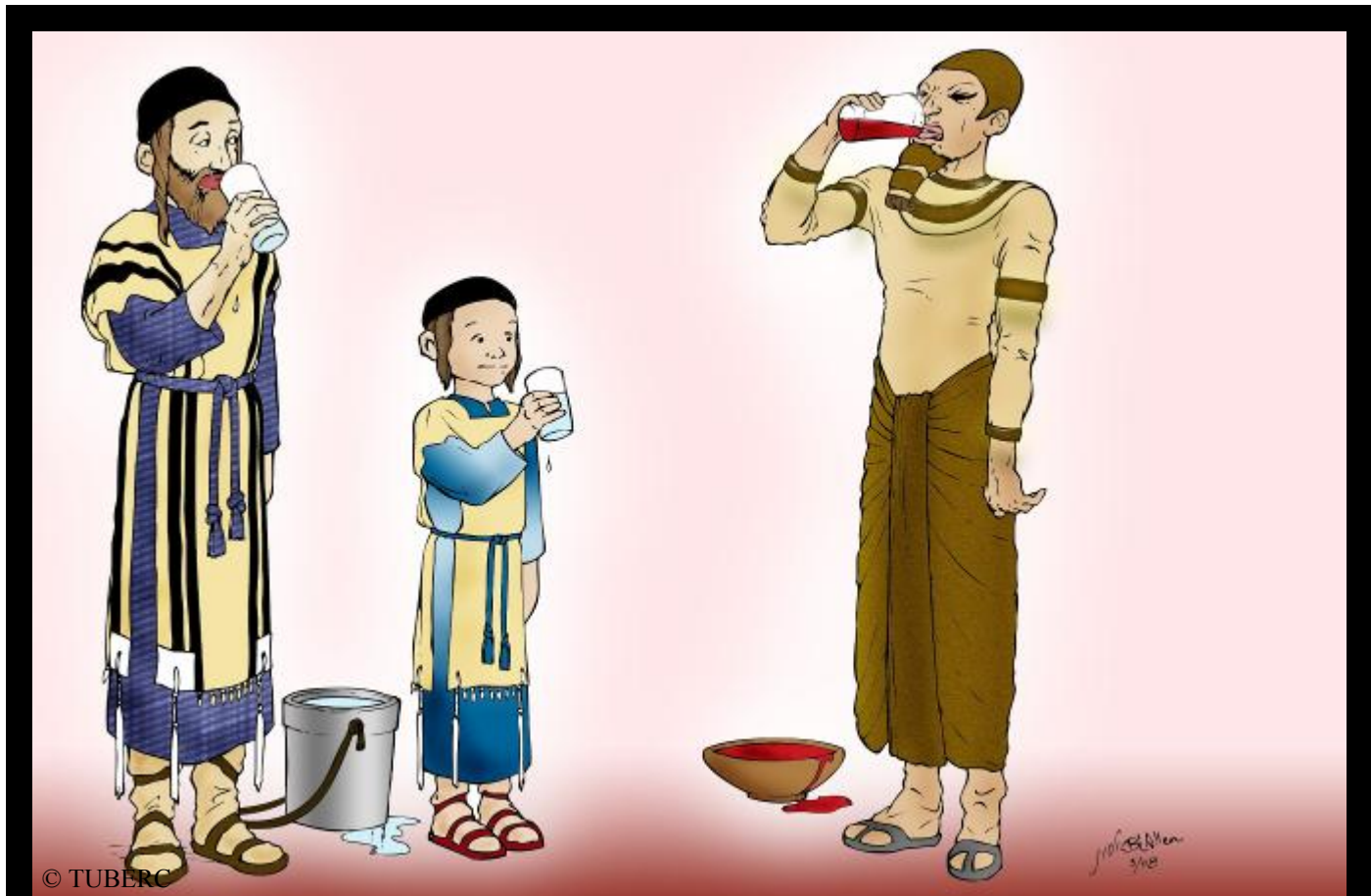
