# ROLE CALL GAME

## Instructions

**Setup:** Each pair or group receives a set of Role Cards. Place them face down so only the job descriptions on the back are visible. Do not flip them yet.

### Round 1 - Responsibility Ranking

Using only the job descriptions, with no names visible, arrange the cards in order from least to most responsibility. Discuss with your partner or group before settling on a final order.

### Flip & Reveal

Once your order is set, flip all the cards over to see the actual role names, such as student, artist, or president.

### Round 2 - Impact Ranking

Leave the cards where they are. Now reorder them based on a new question: If this role were missing for just one day, how much would it matter? Rearrange from least impact to greatest impact.

### Discussion

Look at your final arrangement and share what you notice:

- Did roles with more responsibility also tend to have more impact?
- Were there any surprises - roles that ranked differently than you expected?

### Takeaway

The activity illustrates that the more significant a role, the greater its responsibility - and the greater the void when it is absent. This connects to **ורוממתנו**: Hashem elevated us to the most meaningful role of all: being Yidden. As we approach Kabbalas HaTorah, we are reminded of the tremendous responsibility, impact, and privilege that comes with that role.

Starts the day with reports about what is happening across the country and around the world. Meets with advisors to make big decisions about safety, laws, money, and emergencies. Gives speeches, solves problems, and helps lead millions of people through both ordinary days and national crises.

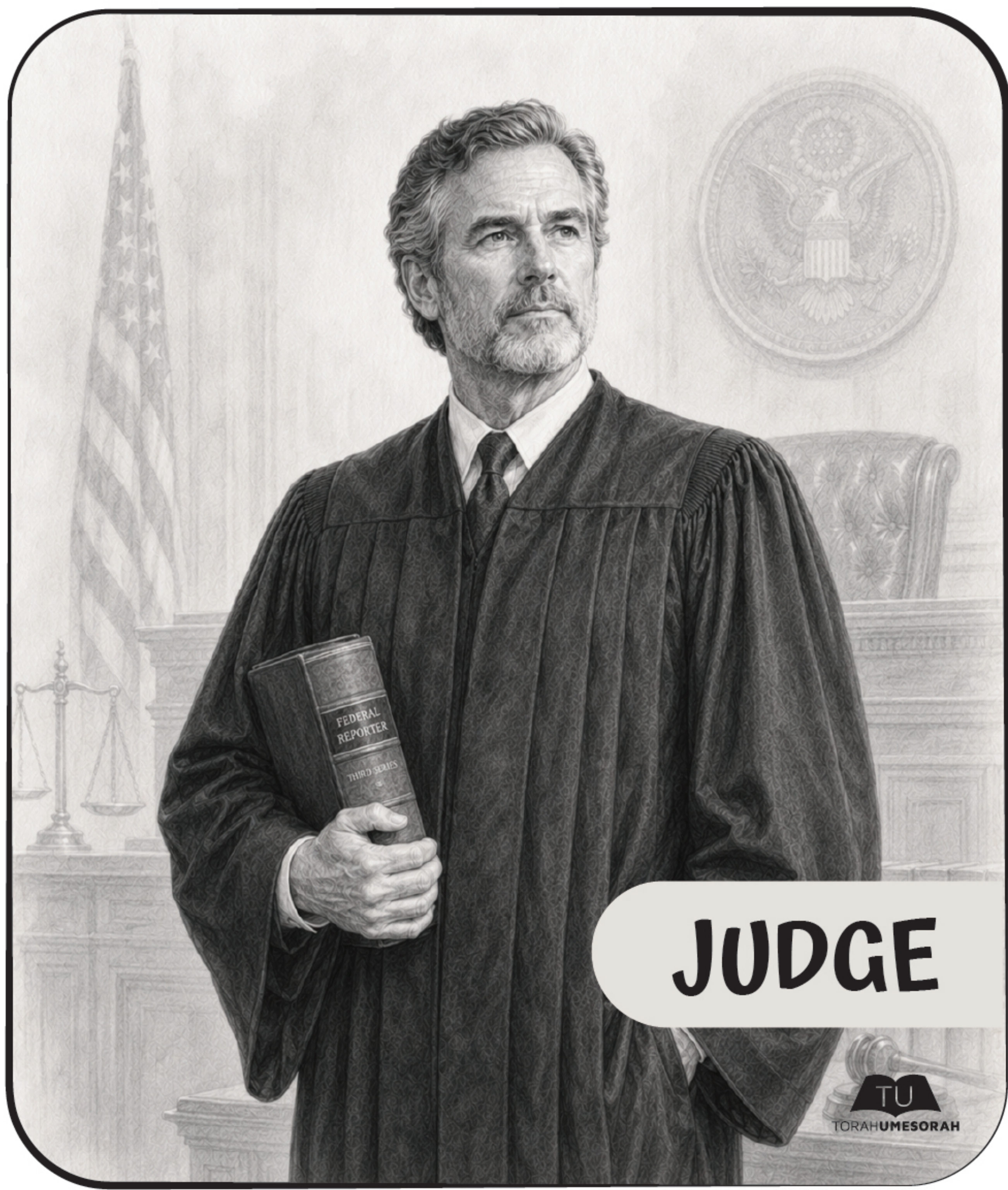
Wakes up early to review plans, lead teams of soldiers, and prepare for emergencies. Makes difficult decisions under pressure, gives important instructions, and helps protect the country when danger arises. Responsible for many lives and must stay calm in stressful situations.

Spends the day in a courtroom listening carefully as different people explain their side of a problem. Reads laws, asks thoughtful questions, and makes decisions that can change someone's future. Must think about fairness, justice, and responsibility every day.

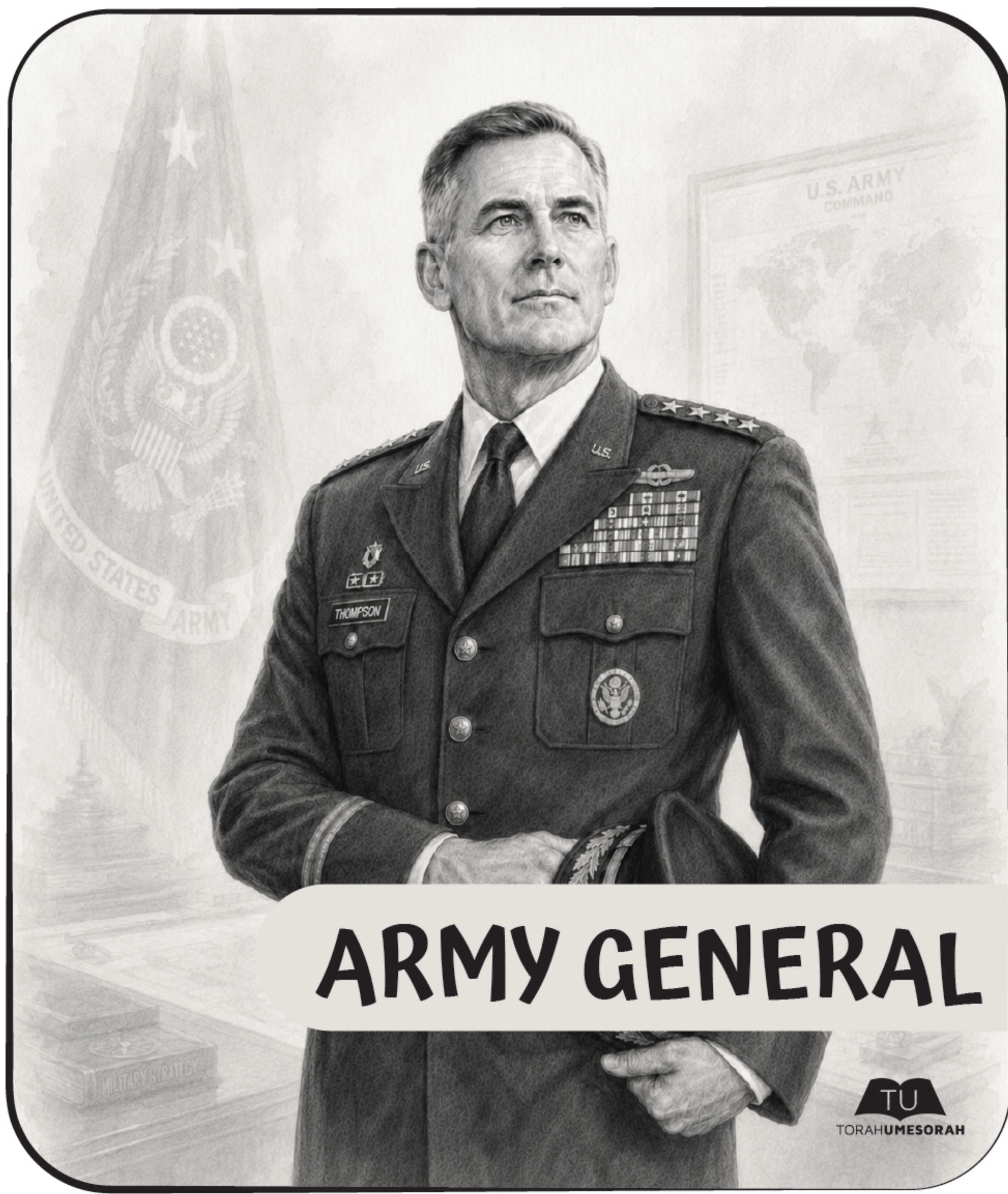
Gets called into the hospital at all hours—sometimes in the middle of the night—when someone's life is in danger. Rushes into the operating room, works with a medical team, and performs delicate surgery where every second matters. One decision could save a life.

Arrives before sunrise to check weather, inspect the airplane, and review the flight plan. Guides hundreds of passengers safely through the sky, making constant decisions during takeoff, landing, and unexpected turbulence. Responsible for everyone on board.

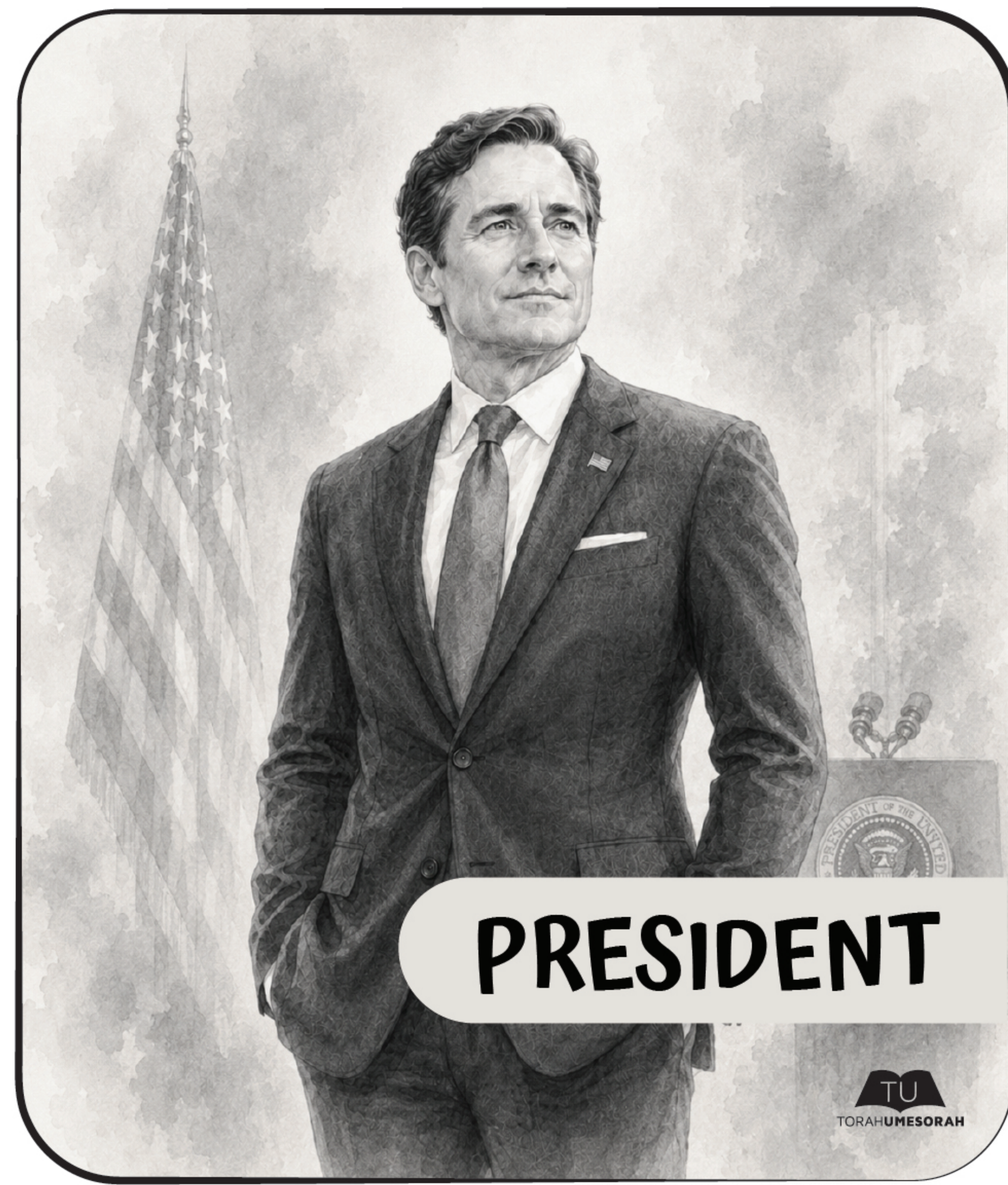
